Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Responds to Helene and a Shooting

This week at Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has been especially busy:

- 4-person team from National Response Team (NRT) deployed to Tampa Bay Presbytery in support of the presbytery response to hurricane damage (6 churches suffered significant water damage).
- 4-person NRT team deployed to Western Carolina Presbytery in support of the presbytery response to devastating flooding from Helene.
- 2-person NRT team to Transylvania Presbytery to offer listening session to Presbyterian Church and community in the wake of the shooting of a local judge by the local sheriff; the Presbyterian Church is across the street from the courthouse.
