



#### **Prayer and Meditation**

There are two important traditions at Westover Hills that join our voices in prayer every week. The first is *Prayer on the 9's*. Every day you are able, join us in taking a minute to pause at 9am and 9pm to offer a short prayer for the church, the world, or someone you know who needs comfort. Every Sunday in the bulletin and every Wednesday in the Careline e-newsletter, we share the list of pastoral care concerns known to the church. Members and friends are invited to pray for those people and world issues named on the list. Prayers of comfort, for healing, and for peace are always appropriate ways to remember our friends and neighbors. This week we remember:

From Max Snowden: "I want to thank everyone for your prayers, cards, food and constant concern and support that you have shared with Ann and me during the past few months. In

January, I received a good report from my PET scan thanks to my medical team and the outstanding care and companionship of Ann & my family. After 3 chemo treatments, the tumor in my lung had shrunk substantially. My oncologist said, 'you must have a lot of people praying for you' and we assured him that yes, we do. Though I'm recovering slowly, I am making progress. My next treatment plan includes daily radiation therapy for 6 weeks beginning in mid-February, along with concurrent chemo therapy every three weeks that started last week and will continue

until mid-April. We are hopeful that another PET scan - scheduled for 8 weeks after my last radiation treatment - will show even greater improvement. (Perhaps it will show I'm cancerfree!) Thanks again for the pravers.": Donna Warmack; Tammy Miller's brother Robin as he is in Hospice; Anna Morgan - Grandniece of Kathy Phillips - Suffering from cystic fibrosis, and in ICU; Charlie Frith, recovering from surgery; Liz Gath, undergoing chemo; Jennifer Garlington, Shirley Garlington's niece, started new treatments to combat renewed cancer growth; Survivors, responders, and communities impacted by wildfires, especially in the LA area; John Bowyer, friend of Ann & Max, bone biopsy procedure; Judi King, ongoing health concerns; Max Snowden, undergoing treatment for cancer; Sam Highsmith, in hospice care at Presbyterian Village; Beth Highsmith, in memory care in Alabama near her daughter; Isatu Lebbie continuing to recover from a stroke; Ellen Dreyfuss, Nancy's friend, just had emergency brain surgery; Rene Thompson, friend of Joyce Smith, dealing with cancer treatments; Stacy Harter dealing with cancer; Monroe Flucas, Jr., Julie Gaffney, Martin Gaffney, Richard Gaffney, Eunice Holdcroft as they deal with health issues (friends of Judi King); Our members and friends at Presbyterian Village; The WHPC Staff: Robert, Tammy, David, Ulysses, and Shawn
